













## Theme:

WCLAC, through its dedicated field researchers, undertakes the challenging task of documenting Israeli violations against Palestinian women in Gaza, the West Bank, and Jerusalem. Despite numerous obstacles such as fear of Israeli occupation officers, reluctance to speak out due to societal stigma, and the constant threats posed by bombings and road closures, our field researchers have succeeded in gathering stories from courageous women. These remarkable individuals, despite enduring constant fear and horror, have bravely agreed to share their experiences and document the injustices they face. Their resilience and determination serve as a testament to the urgent need for advocacy and action to protect the rights and dignity of Palestinian women.

In Gaza, the escalating genocide has disproportionately impacted the most vulnerable, with shocking statistics revealing the heavy toll on women, children, and newborns. As of March 5<sup>th</sup>, over 30 thousand people have lost their lives, with women and children accounting for over 70% of the casualties. Additionally, almost 952,000 women and girls are internally displaced in Gaza, living in destitute conditions, out in the open or in severely overcrowded shelters that lack basic necessities.
