 Clarify aspects of linking the guidance note for preparing the progress report on the Beijing +30 with the 2030 Agenda and Plan for Sustainable Development.

Present and discuss section four in the national report on the progress made in the Beijing +30

2030 Agenda under the Guidance Note on Reviewing Beijing +30



- It is known that the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development takes into account all international frameworks related to human rights and gender equality, including the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action.
- The +30 review will be the second review of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action in comparison to the 2030 Agenda.
- We need to see the review as an opportunity to assess the level of interconnection between efforts to implement the Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA) and the 2030 Agenda, and to coordinate between the different frameworks for implementing each of them, and to follow up and monitor the progress made.

Guidance Note: Part 1: Review Procedure Mechanism

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According to the Guidance Note:

- The review shall be inclusive, participatory, transparent and thorough, based on evialso producing tangible lessons and solutions, which should be followed by concret collaboration towards the implementation of the BPfA and the SDGs.
- Collaboration and alignment with other existing institutional arrangements, in partice responsible for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development or preparation of relevant reports.
- Additionally, sources of information should include periodic reports submitted to treaty bodies, and <u>Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs)</u> under the <u>2030 Agenda for Sustainable</u>
 <u>Development</u>.
- You'll find that the survey includes questions on the interconnectedness of the 2030 Agenda implementation.

Leveraging VNRs in the Comprehensive National-Level Reports for Beijing +30

- All Arab States (except Yemen) have submitted VNRs on the Sustainable Development Plan since 2016, some have submitted such reports more than one time.
- During the period of the comprehensive national-level review of the Beijing Platform for Action +25, in 2019, six Arab States also submitted their voluntary review reports on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (which were Algeria, Tunisia, Iraq, Oman, Kuwait, and Mauritania).
- Between 2020 2023, 15 Arab countries submitted their voluntary review reports on the Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- Five of these states submitted their reports in 2022, with the SDG 5 selected to be the focus of the High-Level Political Forum (HLPF).
- Six states (Syria, Palestine, Libya, Egypt, Mauritania, and for the first time Yemen) intend to submit voluntary review reports on the Sustainable Development Plan in 2024.
- 20 out of 22 states have submitted their comprehensive national-level reviews on the progress made in the Beijing +25 (Somalia and Yemen have not submitted their reviews).

Section Three: Progress across the 12 critical areas of concern.

- This section focuses on providing a more detailed analysis of measures taken to advance gender equality across the twelve critical areas of concern of the BPfA and the relevant SDGs.
- This part is divided, as noted, into six thematic clusters that includes guiding questions to reflect on how the BPfA and the 2030 Agenda can be implemented in a mutually reinforcing manner to accelerate progress for all women and girls.
- Hence, the interconnectedness between the responses and thematic groups, critical areas of interest, the targets of the Sustainable Development Goals and the principle of leaving no one behind must be observed in the narrative report.
