


Women's Social Status and Multiple Vulnerabilities

Figure 13. Share of female-headed households, latest available data (percentage)



Figure 16. Proportion of age-specific widowed population (60-64 years), latest available data (percentage)



Leave No One Behind Principles

- Promote and protect all fundamental rights and freedoms for all women throughout their life cycle.
- The central, transformative promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the SDGs. It requires combating discrimination and inequality and addressing root causes.
- These discriminatory factors affect diverse groups of women and impede the process of gender equality and the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action.
- National mechanisms are required to provide sufficient information and data on the situation of marginalized groups in reporting to understand the progress made in their access to their fundamental rights.


