Advancing Gender Equality: In Humanitarian Action in the Arab States Region



The regional results presented in the infographic are based on data from over 10,000 surveys conducted in Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Palestine, Syria and Yemen.

Close to 470,000 lives reached across 8 countries in the Arab States in 2024

In emergencies, women and girls face greater risks to their safety, dignity, and future: increased risks of gender-based violence, reduced access to services, forced into harmful coping mechanisms and little say in decisions that impact their lives.

But they are also the drivers of recovery, holding the key to building stronger, more resilient communities.

Here is how UN Women changed the lives of women and girls across the region through gender-responsive humanitarian assistance


